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1. Introduction

These Release Notes provide an overview of Fuse Management Central 1.9.1, including new features, delivery information and supported platforms. It is recommended that you read these release notes in conjunction with the documentation included with the software package. If any conflicts exist, the Release Notes supersede the other documentation.

2. About Fuse Management Central

This section provides an overview of Fuse Management Central 1.9.1.

Fuse Management Central is a centralized web administration console for OpenText™ solutions, providing Self-Managed Customers or Managed Service Providers with a Unified Management Experience. With its intuitive user interface and simplified deployment, OpenText™ system administrators can now interact directly from a system component, maintaining context and understanding of it, with the option to schedule any action.

Fuse Management Central also separates system administration from content administration, introducing a new layer of security on top of the traditional OpenText™ administration tools.

2.1. What is New in Release 1.9.1

Fuse Management Central 1.9.1 includes the following innovations:

- **Kubernetes and OpenShift Containerization Support**

Added official **Helm chart** deployment and **OpenShift** support for Fuse Management Central Server and Fuse Management Client for OpenText Content Server and OpenText Archive Center.

- **Grouped Dashboard Overview Widgets**

The Dashboard is now organized into **grouped widgets**, separating common infrastructure metrics from application-specific ones for OTCS and OTAC, with each application group shown only when relevant systems are in scope.

- **HyperLens – Request Duration Filter**

Added a new **execution duration** filter, with a configurable threshold and time unit, combinable with existing HyperLens filters.

- **HyperLens – Full Request URL in Request Details**

The **full request URL** is now available in the request header metadata, resolved per channel type.

- **HyperLens – Log Level Compliance**

When OTCS log levels fall below the HyperLens minimum requirement, a **disclaimer** is now displayed in the Request Details and a per-system **compliance alert** is raised, with one-click remediation for non-compliant channels.

- **Extended Queue Tables Monitoring**

Extended Queue Tables monitoring to the OpenText Content Server **BlobData** and **RetentionUpdateOrder** tables, along with alerting logic across all supported databases.

- **Configuration Policies Usability Improvements**

Configuration Policies are now ordered by **status then name**, and each Configuration Policy entry is now clickable to open the Configuration Policies page, pre-filtered by the contextualized system or environment.

- **Remote Script Execution – Exit Code Success Handling**

The Remote Script success or failure is now derived from the **exit code**, with 0 treated as success by default, support for user-defined success codes, and the raw code logged for troubleshooting. The interface supports a calendar range picker with built-in validation rules, preventing invalid ranges and future dates. This enables more flexible and precise reporting aligned with operational needs.

- **Kubernetes and OpenShift Helm Deployment Support**

Add support for deploying Fuse Management Central and Fuse Management Client for OpenText Archive Center on Kubernetes/OpenShift using Helm chart packages delivered with the product package.

The Installation and Administration Guide contains the Helm deployment procedures. Each chart package includes a `README.md`, and each deployment folder includes a commented `values-example.yaml` file.

- **Security Update: Encryption Library Used by the OTAC Client**

This release updates the encryption library that protects the Archive Center password stored by the Fuse Management Client for OpenText Archive Center (OTAC Client), fixing two known vulnerabilities in that library (CVE-2025-14813 and CVE-2026-5598).

! This fix was already included in version 1.9.1. If you are upgrading from **1.9.1 or later**, no action is needed. If you are upgrading from a version **prior to 1.9.1** (e.g. 1.9.0), the OTAC Client can no longer read a password that was saved by your previous version. **After upgrading, in the Fuse UI go to Edit System for this OTAC system and re-enter the Archive Center password once**, so it gets sent to the OTAC Client and stored under the new encryption. No other configuration, activation status, or history is affected, and this is only a one-time step.

2.2. General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) Compliance

The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) is a European Union (EU) law that provides residents with greater protection and control over their personal data. For these reasons, Fuse Management Central is and must be GDPR compliant.

4.1.2. Docker Support

To install Fuse Management Central 1.9.1, Docker and Docker Compose are required:

- **Docker Engine 18.06.0 or higher**
- **Docker compose 1.25 or higher**

4.1.3. Helm Deployment Support

Fuse Management Central 1.9.1 supports Kubernetes/OpenShift deployment using Helm chart packages delivered with the Fuse Management Central package.

Helm 3 is required on the operator workstation or automation runner. The target Kubernetes/OpenShift platform must provide the required namespaces, storage classes, image availability, ingress or route endpoints, and any platform-level policies needed by the deployment.

4.2. Java Support

The following list describes the version of Java required for Fuse Management Central 1.9.1. It is highly recommended that you use the specified Java versions listed below, as our testing focuses on these combinations:

- **Adoptium Eclipse Temurin JDK 17 or higher**
- **Oracle JDK 17 or higher**



Free long term support (LTS) versions of JDK are provided by [Adoptium Eclipse Temurin](#) and [Oracle](#). We recommend you install a long term support version to use with Fuse Management Central.

4.5. Hardware Requirements

This section provides details about Fuse Management Central 1.9.1 hardware requirements:

Processor	• Minimum: 4 CPU @ 2GHz • Recommended: 8 CPU @ 2GHz
Memory	• Minimum: 8GB • Recommended: 16GB
Disk Space	• Minimum: 50GB • Recommended: 100GB



Disk space consumption has an estimated growth rate around 0.1GB/day/system and this data is kept for 31 days by default, for long term metrics. HyperLens data is only kept for 24 hours by default.



The values provided represent estimated disk usage only and do not account for the additional space required by HyperLens. Estimating HyperLens disk usage is challenging, as it collects and processes logs from OpenText Content Server. The actual space requirements depend on several factors, including the number of systems being analyzed, the duration for which HyperLens remains enabled and the workload generated by users on Content Server during that period. As a result, the required disk space for HyperLens can vary significantly.

4.5.1. Kubernetes/OpenShift Helm Resource Guidelines

The following values are starting guidelines for Kubernetes/OpenShift Helm deployments. Actual sizing depends on the number of managed systems, metric retention, alert volume, storage backend performance, and platform policies.

<code>alertmanager</code>	Deployment	250m	512 MiB	No PVC by default	Alert delivery runtime. Persistence is optional only when durable silences or operational state continuity are required.
<code>fuse-management-client-for-otac</code>	Deployment	500m	1 GiB	128 MiB for client state	Must run in the same namespace as OpenText Archive Center. OTAC workload storage is monitored from OTAC PVCs, not from the client state PVC.

For larger environments, use higher initial requests such as 2 vCPU and 4 GiB for Fuse Management Central, PostgreSQL, and Prometheus, then tune based on observed usage.

6. Fixed Issues and Enhancements

Fuse Management Central 1.9.1 introduces a range of fixed issues and enhancements. Below is a comprehensive list of the improvements and resolved issues included in this release:

- 3389 - Header layout breaks when opening the Running Operations dropdown at lower resolutions
- 4080 - Vue Router "navigation cancelled" error when clicking certain chart points
- 4088 - Unable to scroll to the bottom of the page when request properties are open

- 4375 - Duration values overflow their container for large durations
- 4480 - Numbers truncated in the Operations and Maintenance tables

- 4878 - Password field incorrectly shows "Unchanged" placeholder when disabling credential inheritance
- 4879 - Sessions not collected correctly
- 4882 - System report job getting cancelled
- 4886 - Newly created Configuration Policies not displayed
- 4893 - "Revert Changes" button and item counter mismatch
- 4894 - Removed pgAdmin from the distribution
- 4898 - Environment popover not shown for environment badges on the Dashboard
- 4909 - Test email can be sent without an email configured
- 4911 - Incorrect password placeholder and "Test connection" button state when editing an active system
- 4912 - Incorrect AC or Spawner binaries path not producing the expected behaviour
- 4915 - Multi-select filter expansion breaks layout alignment on the Operations page
- 4916 - OTCS log level changes not applied despite a successful job status
- 4918 - Admin Server disappearing from the System Object Volume when in Safe Mode
- 4928 - Systems page breaks with a black background after the "Welcome to Fuse" modal redirection
- 4929 - Long tag names not wrapping or truncating correctly
- 4930 - Incorrect default loading state for empty data on the "Content Overview" widget
- 4940 - Missing vertical spacing between email badges
- 4941 - Description tooltip overflowing the viewport with no text wrap or character limit
- 4949 - Non-standard hover effect on the more-options button on the Dashboard page
